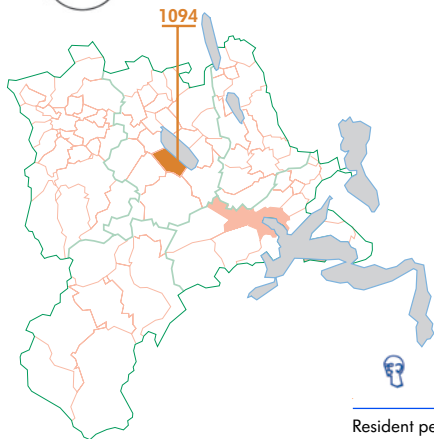




Nottwil

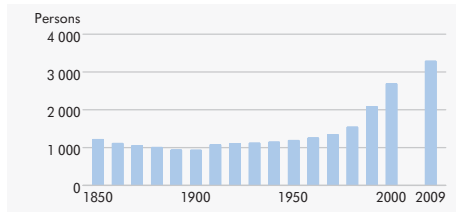
